The Bachelor of Education (Honours) in Primary Education prepares students to become qualified primary school teachers. It suits secondary school leavers and other entrants who wish to teach children aged approximately six to twelve, and who want a degree that leads to formal teacher qualification recognised by the Education Bureau.

Structure and Duration

The programme is offered full-time over four years. The curriculum totals around 120 credit points, combining compulsory education courses, one or two teaching subject specialisms, general education courses and supervised teaching practice. Students typically take four to five courses each term, with teaching practice concentrated in dedicated blocks during the later years of study.

What You Will Study

- Child and adolescent development
- Primary curriculum and pedagogy across core subjects
- Teaching methods in a chosen subject specialisation, such as Chinese, English, Mathematics or General Studies
- Classroom management and inclusive teaching strategies
- Assessment for learning in the primary classroom
- Use of information technology in teaching
- Supervised teaching practice in primary schools

Entry Requirements

- Satisfaction of the general entrance requirements of the University, including the minimum requirements in the Hong Kong Diploma of Secondary Education Examination or an equivalent qualification
- A satisfactory level of attainment in Chinese Language and English Language
- A satisfactory result at interview

- Non-local qualifications are considered individually against equivalent standards

Career Prospects

Graduates are eligible to register as qualified primary school teachers in Hong Kong. Most graduates take up teaching posts in government, aided or private primary schools, while others progress into curriculum panel or subject-leadership roles, school administration, or further study at postgraduate level.

Remarks: Programme details, including subject specialisation options and teaching practice arrangements, are subject to approval by the University's academic bodies and may be revised from time to time. The University reserves the right to amend, suspend or discontinue the programme.

How to apply

- Applications open in the autumn preceding entry and are made online through the University admissions system.
- Applicants supply academic transcripts, evidence of language proficiency where required, and the names of two referees.
- Shortlisted applicants are invited to an interview, held on campus or online, between January and April.
- Offers are issued on a rolling basis. Applicants are advised to apply early, as places in popular specialisations fill before the closing date.
